In an era of angry rhetoric, we need to return to the kind of love which Jesus revealed in his life and teaching. Using images and parables from the New Testament, we will explore the concrete, consoling, and demanding images of love that the Lord presents to every baptized believer.

Our presenter, Rev. Michael A. Renninger, is a priest of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond (VA). Born and raised in Pennsylvania, he studied piano, voice and, guitar while in high school. He attended Ursinus College (PA), and later attended The Catholic University of America, where he received graduate degrees in Theology and Liturgy. He was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Richmond in 1993 and has served as Vicar for Vocations and Rector of the Cathedral. He currently serves as pastor of St. Mary's Church in Richmond. In addition to his parish duties, Fr. Mike travels extensively to serve as a guest preacher and retreat leader, has presented vocal recitals in a number of states, and has been a soloist with the Richmond Symphony. He has published articles on liturgy, prayer, and spirituality. Fr. Mike enjoys jogging, Oreo cookies, and Elvis.
